1st Reading: HB 1:2-3; 2:2-4
Reader: A reading from the book of
the prophet Habakkuk

How long, O LORD? I cry for help but you do not listen!
I cry out to you, "Violence!" but you do not intervene.
Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery?
Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and clamorous discord.
Then the LORD answered me and said: Write down the vision clearly upon the tablets,

so that one can read it readily.

For the vision still has its time,
presses on to fulfillment, and will not
disappoint;

if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late. The rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of his faith, shall live.

nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel

in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

Guard this rich trust with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us.
